

ACADEMY PERFORMANCE STANDARDS

Initial:	

- Students must pass all mandatory-pass components of the course.
- Students must achieve a minimum academic average of 80% to successfully complete the course.
- Failure to meet academic standards will be grounds for dismissal from the CSO Basic Course and may result in termination of employment with the City of San Jose.

STUDENT CONDUCT

Initial:	

- •Students are expected to maintain the highest professional standards of conduct and behavior.
- •Students will be held to Department standards of professionalism and conduct.
- •Students are expected to adhere to the highest levels of honesty and integrity.
- •Academic dishonesty and cheating shall not be tolerated.
- •Students are expected to report misconduct immediately to their Supervisor or the Course Coordinator.
- •Students may be disciplined for misconduct up to and including dismissal from the CSO Basic Course and termination of employment with the City of San Jose.

- •Academy tests account for 25% of the overall course grade.
- •Academy tests may include, but are not limited to:
 Weekly Tests, Radio Code Quizzes and Penal Code Quizzes

DEFENSIVE DRIVING:

Initial:	

- •Defensive Driving is a mandatory-pass component of the CSO Basic Course.
- •Failure to pass will result in academic failure.
- •Defensive Driving accounts for 20% of the overall course grade.
- •Exercise test components are set by the Course Coordinator.
- •Defensive Driving is scored as Pass/Fail
 - •Passing the initial test = 100%
 - •Passing the re-test = 80%
 - •Failing the re-test = 0% (course failure)
- •Students must pass all exercise test components to pass.
- •Remedial instruction and re-testing will be administered as directed by the Course Coordinator

REPORT WRITING:

Initial:

- •Report Writing is a mandatory-pass component of the CSO Basic Course.
- •Failure to pass will result in academic failure.
- •Report Writing accounts for 25% of the overall course grade.
- •Report writing standards are outlined in the student RW manual.
- •Students must score at least a 4 (on a 1-7 scale) to pass the final RW exam.
- •Remedial instruction and re-testing will be administered as directed by the Course Coordinator.

FIRST AID & CPR:

Initial:

- •First Aid & CPR is a mandatory-pass component of the CSO Basic Course.
- •Failure to pass will result in academic failure.
- •First Aid & CPR accounts for 20% of the overall course grade.
- •Tested components are set by the Course Coordinator.
- •First Aid & CPR are scored as Pass/Fail.
 - •Passing the initial test = 100%
 - •Passing the re-test = 80%
 - Failing the re-test = 0% (course failure)
- •Students must pass all test components to pass.
- •Remedial instruction and re-testing will be administered as directed by the Course Coordinator

REMEDIAL TRAINING & RE-TESTING:

Initial:

- •Remedial training and one re-test will be offered for students who fail any test.
- •Remedial training will be administered as directed by the Course Coordinator.
- •It is the student's responsibility to attend remedial sessions.
- •Students who fail to attend a remedial session will forfeit the training.
- •The re-test will be administered no sooner than 24-hours after the remedial training (to provide the student time to study and prepare for the re-test).
 - •Exception: remedial training and re-testing for Defensive Driving will be administered during the initial training session.
- •Students who pass a retest will receive a score of 80%.
 - •Exception: Passing a Report Writing re-test will result in a score of 4.
