



- Systems Control type codes will not recommend a response level. Fire Communications will determine who will respond depending on who is logged from Public Works, Streets & Traffic or is "On Call"
- Remember that Systems Control is also responsible for all City buildings, radios and callout of CAD technical support.

- CAD
  - Problems with the CAD terminals at PAC or PAB
- CB
  - Plugged catch basins or storm drains
- CLET
  - Problems with the CLETS lines or returns
- DEBRIS
  - Requests for cleanup of debris left in public areas
    - Garbage, tree limbs, branches, etc.

#### • GENERAL

- Miscellaneous calls for service:
  - Sheared off fire hydrants
  - Potholes in the city
  - Missing traffic signs
  - Refrigerators
  - Missing storm grates or drains


#### GSBLDG

Maintenance of City buildings

- GSCOMM
  - Police call box repairs
- GSELECT
  - Electrical Problems in any city building
- IWS
  - Log event for problem with the IWS system
- LIMB
  - Fallen tree limbs or branches

- LOG
  - Miscellaneous log entry:
    - Equipment malfunction at PAC or PAB
- PARKS
  - Problem at any city park which includes:
    - Sprinklers, drinking fountains and park maintenance
- RADIO
  - Radio system or mobile radio problems

- **SEWER** 
  - Plugged sewer lines or manholes
- SIGNAL
  - Problems with traffic signals
- STLITE
  - Problems with street lights
- **WATER** 
  - Water problems



#### CAD

- What is the location of the problem?
- Is it one console or position?

#### CB

- What is the extent of the flooding?
- Is the water over the curb or sidewalk?
- Is anyone trapped in vehicles?
- Are any structures threatened?
- What is the RP's phone number & address?

#### CLET

- What information is not being received or transmitted?
- Are you receiving error messages?
- Are the CLETS line down for maintenance?
- Send a message to all terminals that CLETS is down

- DEBRIS
  - Is this a traffic or safety hazard?
  - What kind of debris is it?
  - What is the size and the amount of the debris?
  - Where is the location of the items?

- GENERAL
  - Sheared off hydrants
    - Is there any water leaking
    - Is the hydrants still as the scene?
  - Potholes in the street?
    - Which lane of traffic
    - Is it causing a traffic hazard?
    - What are the depth and size of the hole?
  - Missing traffic signs
    - What is the exact location?
    - What is the sign? stop, speed limit or yield sign
    - Is the sign still there?

- GENERAL
  - Refrigerators
    - Is the refrigerator on public or private property?
    - If on private property PD will need to respond.
    - If on private property and deemed a hazard by PD Code Enforcement needs to be notified.
  - Storm Grates or Storm Drains
    - What is the location of the missing grate or drain?
    - Is it causing a traffic or pedestrian hazard?
    - What are the depth and size of the hole?

- GSBLDG
  - For Maintenance of City buildings only
    - Where or what building is the problem occurring?
    - Detailed description of the problem and is a callout necessary?
      - Is it the HVAC
      - A problem in the restroom
      - Locked in the building?

- GSCOMM
  - Police Call Box repairs
    - Is the call box damaged or is it malfunctioning?
    - What is the number on the call box?
- GSELECT
  - Electrical problems in city buildings
    - What is the location, building and or room number where the problem is?
    - The city electrician will respond on any electrical problem other than signals and streetlights.

- \* IWS
  - Log event for problems with Intelligent Work Stations at PAC
    - What is the problem and is it at all the consoles or at one position only?
    - Is a dropped call form required?

#### LIMB

- What are the dimensions of the tree including diameter?
- Is this a city or private property?
- Is there any damage to private property? If, so PD should respond for a report.
- Is it causing a traffic or pedestrian hazard?

Do not use the type TREE unless you want a fire response.

- LOG
  - Is the equipment malfunction at PAC or PAB?
  - How many police vehicles are out of service?
- PARKS
  - What is the location of the problem?
  - What is the problem?
  - Is it a hazard?

- \* RADIO
  - Radio systems problems or mobile radio repairs
    - Is this one piece of equipment or is it a system wide problem?
    - Is this one channel or multiple channels?
    - What are or areas is the problem occurring?
    - Are all MDT's down in the city?

- \* SEWER
  - Plugged sewer lines or overflowing manholes
    - Is the problem inside or outside a structure?
      - If inside, is it actively flooding any part of the structure?
    - Does the RP have a city clean out ?
      - Normally near the street
    - Is it causing a traffic or pedestrian hazard?

- SIGNAL
  - Problems with traffic signals
    - What is the exact location and direction of travel?
    - Is the outage in all directions or at one locations?
    - Are the signals completely out or stuck one color or flashing?
    - Is it an overhead or a standard?
    - Is there any damage to pole and are wires exposed?
    - Is there any damage to the pole?
    - Is there a power outage in the area prior to the signal problem?

- STLITE
  - Street light problems
    - Is the light burnt out?
    - Is glass broken?
    - Is there any damage to the pole?
    - What is the pole number?
    - Are any wire exposed?
  - If not any of the above and this is a problem with one light, the RP can contact City Street Light Program at X5517 (24 Hours) and leave a message.

#### WATER

- San Jose Municipal Water Company covers the Evergreen and Alviso areas only. Most of the requests are for water being turned off, broken and or leaking pipes and meters.
  - How much water is flowing?
  - Is it causing a traffic hazard or pedestrian hazard?
  - If you have no water and no broken pipes are you current in your payments?
    - Systems control does not have billing information!
