Caltrain traverses through the City of San Jose, stopping at the following stations:

- College Park (780 Stockton Av, beat F3)
- San Jose Diridon (65 Cahill St, beat E1)
- Tamien (1355 Lick Av, beat S5)
- Capitol (3400 Monterey Hwy, beat X1)
- Blossom Hill (5560 Monterey Hwy, beat Y5)

Effective July 1, 2020, the San Mateo County Sheriff's Office Transit Police Bureau changed the service model for law enforcement services on Caltrain. Under the new model, the San Mateo County Sheriff's Office Transit Police Bureau will:

- Investigate all Caltrain train related accidents (train vs. vehicle), and/or Caltrain suicides/trespasser strikes occurring in Santa Clara County.
- Investigate all assaults on conductors and assaults by conductors occurring on trains in Santa Clara County.
- Investigate only the following misdemeanor crime types that occur in the stations, right-ofways, platforms, and on trains: missing persons, lost property, and all bicycle thefts.
- Conduct parking enforcement of Caltrain parking areas, but crimes occurring in the parking areas will be the responsibility of the local agency.

All other crimes will be the responsibility of the local agency.

The San Mateo County Sheriff's Office Transit Police Bureau Sergeants will be the liaison for obtaining rail video footage
