SUBJECT: RESPONSE TO SEVERE CHILD

INJURY OR DEATH

The Santa Clara County Child Abuse Protocol of 2023 (<u>link</u>) will be adhered to when responding to instances of child death and severe child injuries that are the result of **suspected abuse**, **neglect**, **or endangerment**. The protocol applies to all persons under the age of 18 and will be adhered to under the following circumstances:

Death

The Protocol will be activated when a child dies, regardless of the suspected cause of death. The Protocol requires notification to the Santa Clara County District Attorney's Office, the Medical Examiner-Coroner's Office, and the Department of Family and Children Services (DFCS). Additionally, the SJPD Homicide Unit and Crime Scene Unit will be notified immediately upon the death of a child.

Severe Injury

The District Attorney's Office and DFCS should also be contacted when a child suffered from a severe injury suspected of being caused by abuse, neglect, or endangerment. Severe physical injuries include, but are not limited to:

- head trauma
- broken bone(s)
- severe bruising or burns (bruising on infants)
- pattern injuries, such as injuries sustained from severe corporal punishment
- strangulation.

Responses for both the DA's Office and SJPD Bureau of Investigations personnel will be determined on a case-by-case basis. Patrol Lieutenants will request a BOI response only when they deem it is necessary, and will only hold a scene and wait for DA's Office personnel when the DA's Office provides notification that they are responding.
