CHAPTER ONE

1. INTRODUCTION

1.1 Purpose

This publication presents a consolidation of information, procedures, rules and guidelines for the operation of the San Jose Police Department's School Liaison Unit and Truancy and Burglary Suppression Unit (TABS). It complements all existing Department procedures and policies.

This operations manual has the same authority as a Department order and is the definitive authority for the San Jose Police Department School Liaison Unit.

1.2 Mission Statement

The mission of the San Jose Police Department School Liaison Unit is to work with the school districts to provide a safe environment for students and staff to further education. The School Liaison Unit accomplishes this by maintaining positive communications/relationships between the police department and the nineteen school districts in the City of San Jose.

1.3 Revisions

Revisions of the operations manual will be issued in a timely manner as changes in regulations, policies, or procedures occur. It will be the responsibility of each manual holder to maintain a current and up-to-date manual. All employees are encouraged to submit written or oral suggestions for manual changes that will increase the efficiency, effectiveness, or safety of Unit operations. Each unit member will be responsible for periodically reviewing the manual to ensure that it is consistent with industry best practices, and department policies.

CHAPTER TWO

2. UNIT ORGANIZATION

2.1 Assignment

Members assigned to the School Liaison Unit and full time to the TABS Unit will be assigned to the Support Services Division of the Bureau of Field Operations (BFO).

2.2 Captain

The Captain of the Support Services Division oversees the School Liaison Unit and TABS Unit and will perform and be responsible for the following:

- a. Supervise subordinate personnel assigned to the Unit.
- b. Complete required management reports.
- c. Manage fiscal affairs of the Unit, including, but not limited to, expenditures related to equipment purchases, building rent and training needs.
- d. Provide liaison with Department management.

2.3 Sergeant

The Sergeant assigned to the School Liaison Unit will perform and be responsible for the following:

- a. Supervise subordinate personnel assigned to the Unit.
- b. Train personnel as required.
- c. Review and record daily activity of the unit.
- f. Oversee the Guardian Program
- g. Complete required management reports.
- h. Manage fiscal affairs of the Unit, including, but not limited to, expenditures related to equipment purchases, and training needs.
- i. Coordinate and monitor training programs and provide training as required.
- j. Complete all other duties as assigned by the Unit Commander.

2.4 School Liaison Officer

The School Liaison Officer assigned to the School Liaison Unit will perform and be responsible for the following:

- a. Establish and maintain relationships with school staff and students.
- b. Maintain liaison with:
 - 1. School District Offices
 - 2. Schools
 - 3. District Attorney's Office
 - 4. Juvenile Probation Department
 - 5. Appropriate units within the Police Department
- c. Prepare school safety plans for their assigned schools.
- d. Train School Administrators, Teachers, Police Officers, and Students the concepts of the "Run, Hide, Defend" active shooter protocol.
- e. Conduct "Run, Hide, Defend" drills at schools, churches, community centers, etc.
- e. Organize and present Emergency Response Protocol trainings, drills, and crime prevention meetings to schools.
- f. Assist the Crime Prevention Unit in organizing and presenting Emergency Response Protocol trainings, drills and crime prevention at various community and business organizations when required.
- g. Maintain a working knowledge of Juvenile Law and the Educational code of California, specifically section 32282.
- h. Support the Mayor's Gang Prevention Task Force through the Safe School Campus Initiative strategies of prevention, intervention and suppression of school violence.
- i. Assist BFO Patrol by providing guidance with criminal incidents related to schools.
- j. Conduct follow up on school related criminal incidents as necessary.
- k. Complete any reports in a timely manner and ensure they are approved by a supervisor.
- I. Notify the unit supervisor of any complaints received immediately.
- m. Maintain a daily activity log and update the computer log in a timely manner.
- n. Complete all other duties as assigned by the unit supervisor.

2.5 Truancy Abatement and Burglary Suppression (TABS) Coordinator

The TABS Coordinator is a Police Officer position and is assigned to the School Liaison Unit. The TABS Coordinator will perform and be responsible for the following:

- a. Supervise a TABS center during hours of operation.
- b. Schedule and supervise TABS pay car positions.
- c. Supervise juveniles brought to the TABS center and approve final disposition of those juveniles.
- d. Analyze school and crime statistics and deploy TABS pay car officers to assist in crime prevention.
- e. Recruit and supervise college interns at the TABS center.
- f. Maintain liaison with:
 - 1. School District Offices
 - 2. Schools
 - 3. District Attorney's Office
 - 4. Juvenile Probation Department
 - 5. Appropriate units within the Police Department
- g. Record and track statistical information for the TABS center.
- h. Notify the unit supervisor of any complaints received immediately.
- i. Notify the unit supervisor and the Watch Commander of unusual incidents that occur at the TABS center or with TABS pay car officers.
- Support the Mayor's Gang Prevention Task Force through the Safe School Campus Initiative strategies of prevention, intervention and suppression of school violence.
- k. Perform and be responsible for all duties related to a School Liaison Officer when school is not in session and not performing the duties of the TABS Coordinator position.
- I. Complete all other duties as assigned by the unit supervisor.

CHAPTER THREE

3.0 UNIFORMS and EQUIPMENT

3.1 Guidelines

All grooming, dress and regulation uniform guidelines are set forth in the Department's Uniform and Equipment Manual.

The School Liaison Unit is approved as a non-uniformed plainclothes assignment. Duty Manual Section S1128 Minimum On-Duty Non-Uniform Equipment and Attire will be adhered to.

BACKGROUND

In response to recent incidents of violence that have occurred on school campuses across the country, the Department is creating the Guardian Rapid Response Program in order to enhance its ability to swiftly and effectively respond to active shooter incidents. The two primary goals of the Guardian Rapid Response Program are to provide a dedicated team of officers ready to respond to an active shooter incident as well as to provide a focused effort on enhancing the safety of all school campuses in the City of San Jose.

ANALYSIS

Currently, Department personnel are trained to respond to active shooter situations in accordance with the Santa Clara County Police Chiefs' Association Active Shooter Protocol. While this protocol still represents a law enforcement best practice, the Guardian Rapid Response Program will augment this trained response with dedicated teams specifically deployed to immediately respond to reported shooting incidents on school campuses. As part of the Guardian Rapid Response Program, officers will deploy in two-officer vehicles and fulfill the dual roles of immediate active shooter response and strategic school campus safety patrols. Each Guardian Rapid Response Team will remain available in its pre-designated zone to immediately respond to an active shooter threat. The following procedures will be followed as part of the Guardian Rapid Response Program:

• The City has been divided into 9 zones based on each zone's concentration of schools. Each Guardian Unit shall remain in its pre-designated zone for the duration of its shift. If the Guardian Unit needs to leave its zone for administrative purposes, it must first ensure that the district supervisor(s) is aware, and that another Guardian Unit has been designated to provide coverage.

Guardian Unit officers will brief with a school liaison officer each shift. Roll call will be taken
and pertinent information disseminated. The City of San Jose has over twenty school districts, the
School Liaison Unit will monitor the districts for scheduling purposes.

In the event of an active shooter or other shooting at a school, the Guardian Rapid Response					
Program response will consist of	assigned to that zone, as well as all Guardian Unit				
officers assigned to zones immediately adjacent to	the affected zone.				

- When not responding to an active shooter incident or other shooting at a school, the Guardian Unit officers will engage in specific efforts to enhance the safety of all school campuses in the City of San Jose. The purpose of the Guardian Rapid Response Program is not arrest oriented, officers participating in the program are expected to utilize their discretion and take enforcement action if doing so will increase the safety of any school. Each Guardian Unit will conduct the following activities:
 - O High-visibility patrols around school campuses in assigned zones for criminal and/or suspicious activity.
 - O Meet regularly with school administrators to maintain open lines of communication and assist with mitigating any potential threats. o Work with the School Liaison Unit to stay informed of any dangerous situations occurring on school campuses where there is a concern of impending violence.
- The BFO Administrative Unit will be responsible for the Guardian Unit scheduling
- Patrol vehicles will be utilized for the Guardian Rapid Response Program. Officers will only
 check out patrol vehicles that have been specifically identified by the BFO Administrative Unit.
- Guardian Unit officers will deploy with carbines. This program may be augmented with shoulder-fired slug shotguns should the staffing need arise.
- Carbine-qualified sergeants may participate in the Guardian program if there is a shortage of
 qualified officers. Sergeants must seek approval by the Bureau of Field Operations Deputy Chief or
 designee prior to scheduling and work.
- Additional equipment carried by Guardian Unit officers can be checked out at Central Supply and shall include the following:
 - Guardian Unit officers shall report to the pre-designated district sergeant in the zone where they assigned. If the assigned sergeant position is vacant, the Guardian Unit shall report to the sergeant
- are assigned. If the assigned sergeant position is vacant, the Guardian Unit shall report to the sergeant working in the adjacent district. District sergeants are expected to coordinate patrol team response in accordance with the Santa Clara County Active Shooter Protocol in addition to a Guardian Unit response to any active shooter incident. The designated district sergeants for each zone are as follows:

- An administrative Guardian Program sergeant shall be assigned to oversee all administrative duties, however, day-to-day operations will be run and overseen by the district sergeant or sergeant identified to oversee the specific zone.
- •
- The primary goal of the Guardian Program is to increase the Department's state of readiness for an active shooter attack. Officers participating in the program are expected to differentiate between other priority one calls for service (including shootings) that do not fit the four criteria below, and an actual active shooter event. Guardian Unit officers shall respond to reported active shooter events at any location
- Guardian Unit officers shall not be priority dispatched unless it is for an active shooter event or a reported shooting at a school.



 All carbine officers wishing to participate in the Guardian Program shall attend annual active shooter training and maintain current range qualification standards with their carbines.

ORDER

Effective immediately, all sworn personnel participating in the Guardian Program will adhere to the above procedures.
